Four important areas of prayer are:

The first letters of each of these four words form the word "ACTS". Use this as a mental guide for a balanced prayer life.

A - Adoration

- is reflecting on God himself. Praise Him for His love, power, and gift of Christ.

C - Confession

- is admitting your sins to God. Be honest and humble. Remember He knows you, loves you, and will forgive you when you confess.

T - Thanksgiving

- is telling God how grateful you are for everything He has given, even the unpleasant things. Your thankfulness will help you see His purpose.

S - Supplication

- is telling God how grateful you are for everything He has given, even the unpleasant things.

3 You have victory over sin.

What God says about your victory over sin.

No temptation has seized you except for what is common to man. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it. 1 Corinthians 10:13
